Rounds: In addition to round opportunities listed above, clinical pathology rounds include 1 hour sessions Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. Discussion topics include cytologic and histopathologic slide review, discussion of journal articles, discussion of assigned textbook readings, and discussion of laboratory methods. Presentations and publications are encouraged throughout your residency and do not necessarily count as your one meeting per year.

Comments: Teaching: Residents are teaching assistants for Laboratory Diagnosis, a practical laboratory for the third year students (2 days per week) and Clinical Pathology, the main clinical pathology course taught to the second year students. Service: Residents are on duty approximately 2-3 days per week. Samples are evaluated from teaching hospital cases as well as those submitted through the Diagnostic Laboratory.

Comments: Teaching includes DMP715 and 720 which are the second year pathology courses. Duties include gross pathology demonstrations, histopathology instruction, group case work, and writing and grading examinations. There is also teaching of the fourth year students. Service work includes 1-2 days per week of necropsy duty for all three years. Biopsy duty is typically begun during your second year and is usually one day per week with 5-6 per day
